Create an 8-12 inch high clay vessel that is inspired by two seperate forms combining into a cohesive, single piece. The vessel may be inspired by nature or natural forms but it must be abstract, not representative, demonstrate negative space and texture, and hold water. Use coil and/or slab building techniques to complete the piece.

Sketchbook Requirements:

- Divide a page into at least 6 small boxes. Fill each box with a different thumbnail idea for your clay vessel. Draw quickly and don't be picky about shading and such.
- □ Choose the one you'd like to do and draw 2 more views of it (back, looking down onto it, etc.)
- □ Visit 3 websites that feature functional pottery. These websites can feature contemporary pottery that is for sale or it can be all website that features information on classic pottery, for example, Greek pottery. Sketch at least 3 vessels that you find interesting. You may do the drawings in color or in pencil, but you must include a description of the surface decoration if you do not sketch with color.
- Write a brief paragraph that compares and contrasts functional and decorative art. In the paragraph include your personal definition of functional art, which type you would rather create, and why.
- □ Develop 30 minutes a week of free sketching.
