- We will travel around on foot so dress appropriately for whatever weather we have. This is a rain or shine field trip.
- For lunch you will be on your own. You may choose to bring a bag lunch or buy a lunch. The places listed below have lunches available for \$8-10.00. If you have a bag lunch there are some great tables and areas to eat on Broadway by Katie Gingrass Gallery and near MIAD and the fountain area near the bus. (Young Street and Milwaukee Street corner.)

- Architecture this is not a place, but rather an invitation to notice the beautiful
  architectural details around you. This is one of the most historic neighborhoods
  in Milwaukee. Sketch and photograph what you see. Read the signs for clues to
  the past including the great fire and more.
- **ARTWALK** there are a number of sculptures throughout the Third Ward that are officially part of ARTWALK. See how many you can sketch or photograph.
- **Shop Decorations** many of the shops have interesting designs and window decorations. (Anthropologie is one of my favs!)
- The River Front and other fountains there are water features sprinkled throughout the Third Ward including the river itself. You can walk along the river walk near Water Street.
- **Milwaukee Public Market** as mentioned earlier this is a great place to eat, but it's also a great place to sketch, people watch and shoot photos. Kind of dark inside so make sure the camera is set to a wide-open aperture.
- PHOTO WARNING: Make sure you ask before you take photos.
  Some galleries and stores do not want you to shoot photos in them. Make sure it is ok before you start taking photos.
- iPods and Cell Phones: It is ok with me if you have both for this day. I'd actually prefer that you have your cell phone so I can contact you. They iPod needs to be put away during all tours and gallery visits.
